#### What do governors do?

Governors are a group of volunteers who include parents, staff and members of our local community. The school governors are here to ensure Cromford School is well run. We help decide on the direction, focus, aims and values of the school. We help the headteacher and staff plan the school's long term direction and we evaluate progress. Many of our responsibilities carry a statutory requirement. This means we are obliged by law to do things such as agree the annual budget, review school policies which you can view on the school's website, set and assess performance and absence targets, organise some staff recruitment (such as the head). The school governors lead but do not manage the school. The job of day to day management is the responsibility of the headteacher.

# Some of the things we've been working on this term

- The school has been working on introducing the new curriculum. As governors we receive reports from the headteacher and ensure that everything is in place.
- We monitor the School Improvement Plan, which is the document that is put together by staff and governors each year and shows the focus for improvement. By doing this we ensure that the children receive the best possible education.
- We are monitoring our collaboration with Monyash school which is in place until the end of the Summer term.

#### There are different types of governors

Parent Governors: They are parents of children currently at school and are elected by you.

Foundation Governors: The vicar of St Mary's Cromford is automatically appointed as governor. The other Foundation governors are elected by the Diocese. Foundation governors focus on the spiritual life of the school.

Local Authority Governors: They are elected by the local authority and are chosen for their skills.

Community Governors: These governors are elected by the other governors to reflect our community.

Staff Governors: They are elected by all staff to represent them.

Associate Governors: They are elected by the Governing Body for their particular skills and although they don't have voting rights, bring expertise and knowledge to the group.

Currently we have 15 governors including the headteacher. Each governor's term of office is 4 years.

From September 2015 there will be changes to the constitution of the Governing Body. We will inform you of these in our next letter.






#### Nigel Fletcher, Junior Class Teacher, Staff Governor - Teaching & Learning Committee


