- Uses some clearly identifiable letters to communicate meaning, representing some sounds correctly and in sequence.


Early Learning Goal: Writing

For example: The bat wears a hat.








Activity 1b - Rhyming words

1. Can you find the rhyming words? Draw lines to join the rhymes. The first one has been done for you.











Activity 2- Me and you rhymes

2. What rhymes with the word 'me'? Write the words in the diamonds.











1. Can you guess the nursery rhyme from the picture?
