Question time!

What vehicle is the driver operating?
What might he have seen in front of him?
What is the weather like outside?
Is there anyone else depending on the driver to salvage the situation?

What happens to your body when you start to panic? Have you ever panicked? How did you overcome the feeling?

Story starter! Can you continue the story?

The driver glared at the sight in front of him. He simply couldn't believe his eyes!
The blizzard continued to swirl all around them, making it even more difficult to steer. He knew he had to act quickly, or else it would be too late.
The distracting whirling and clanking of machinery all around him didn't help to settle his nerves, but he knew he had to wrestle control of his emotions: his next move was to be a defining one...

There are more ideas and activities online.

- Before we went into lockdown we were studying a book all about how things worked with Dudley the clever dog. Remember how it gave a great imaginative explanation on how a dustbin lorry worked (pigs in the back eating all the rubbish) and then it gave the real explanation. Can you write about a household object and how it works, you could research on the internet or just use your imagination?
- Watch the following short film Soar

The story begins with a young girl called Mara. A thirteen-year-old who dreams of one day becoming an airplane designer. But every day, she test flies her model airplanes in the fields behind her house and every day, they crash. Perhaps the saying if at first you don't succeed try and try again is her motto!

One day, after yet another unsuccessful flying attempt, Mara sits gloomily at a picnic table, trying to come up with new ideas. Suddenly, inspiration hits her on the head – literally. A tiny 5-inch-tall boy and his fantastical flying machine drop out of the sky. She realizes that he is in trouble: his flying ship is broken, and the rest of his fleet is leaving without him. Now Mara must use every ounce of inspiration she has to fly her new friend back home – before it's too late!

Offline

Y4, Y5 & Y6 - Advertise - Create adverts to sell your flying machine to the other miniature aviators. **Y4 – Setting description** - use the image above and collect language that children can use to describe the scene. Discuss how use of language can paint a picture in a reader's mind, so it is important to choose words carefully.

Description - Write a description of the tiny flying machine, focus on component parts.



Y5 - **Dialogue** - Write dialogue between the two characters at different points. When they first meet. Perhaps Lucas is offering encouragement.

Recount - Write Mara's journal detailing her failed attempts and her feelings, children could portray her different feelings when she meets Lucas and when her flying machine finally flies.

Y6 - **Explanation** - explain how the machine works, how it flies and what it is made of.

Persuade - Lucas to use your flying machine rather than Mara's.

Additional activities to be done throughout the week

History: <u>Time capsule</u> use the ideas on here if you can't print it off and make a time capsule for your outdoor space(or bottom of your wardrobe) You could put all sorts in it and plan to open it in the future.

Science:

The bird quiz mentioned last week is here, for those who couldn't find it:

Look at the **fruits and vegetables** you have at home. Ask yourself: Where are the seeds? Compare the size of the seeds.

Find out about the different ways seeds are moved around in nature (dispersal).

Grow a pepper plant. If you have a pepper or chilli at home, you can cut it open to find seeds. Plant the seeds in pots with some soil or compost. Keep them damp and warm (indoors). Track their progress as they grow.

Once they are established (this will take a few weeks!) try putting one outside. Which plant grows quickest? Which looks strongest? Which one will produce fruit first? Which one will produce the largest fruit? If you don't have a pepper, try tomatoes, melon or even cherries
